# Projects

For **EACH** of your projects, tell about, write about, or show:

You can choose from among a variety of formats to display all your projects. This is the place to post photos with captions, to place your ribbons awarded, provide an audiotape, a video presentation, or a written story about each project.

Whatever format you choose, consider answering the following questions.

1. Why did you select this project? Do you like how it turned out? What would you do differently next time?
2. Did it cost money to do this project? How much? How much time did you spend on it?
3. How you shared your project in a public display. At a club meeting, club tour, county fair, school exhibit, arts & crafts show, etc.
4. How you were a leader in this project. Did you do something that helped someone else?

If you do a videotape, please limit this portion to no more than ten minutes.

**PLEASE NOTE!** If you would like to be considered for club, county, district, state, or national 4-H awards, it is to your advantage to do a recordbook that is complete, informative, and contains detailed records (of skills learned, costs incurred, demonstrations given, meetings taught, etc.). This is true regardless of the format you choose to tell your project stories.
